In 2018, the intercultural exchange programme inwändig // auswändig [inside/outside] was launched between artists from the group of Professor Anna Goebel from the University of the Arts in Poznań and artists from Künstlerinnen-Netzwerk [Artists Network] in Leipzig. The collaboration initiated by Louise Walleneit, curator of intershop interdisciplinaire, has resulted in the exhibition of works created in the context of intercultural exchange. The analysis conducted during the workshops under the supervision of Professor Anna Goebel was devoted to the subject of encoding and decoding intercultural communication in public space. Using the techniques of textile art in her works, Anna Goebel refers to local traditions. These techniques were discussed during the workshops. The materials used came from the immediate surroundings – objects found in the streets, parks, buildings and gardens. The German participants signed up for the workshops in response to a call for applications via the Künstlerinnen-Netzwerk in Leipzig. The participants from Poland, on the other hand, came from the group of former students of Professor Anna Goebel. Professor Anna Goebel takes up the theme of her predecessor and mentor Magdalena Abakanowicz, continuing the tradition she left behind. In this context, during the workshops, the artists developed a common method: an artistic polemic about the relativity on both sides of the country borders and its timeless influence on relations, landscapes, cultures, artefacts, everyday life and language.
